JANUARY MEETING

TO OWNERS OF CLUB REGISTERED VEHICLES

RMS has withdrawn Notice 35 issued in December as reported in the last newsletter. It means that any vehicle owners wishing to conditionally register a previously fully registered modified vehicle or a new vehicle with certification under the old Engineering Certification Scheme (ECS) should not take action to recertify their vehicle until RMS have released new guidelines.

UPDATE TO BY-LAWS

The Edition 13 update to the club's By-laws was approved at the January meeting. This affected By-law 6 only with updates to the Registrar's contact details, and some changes to eligibility rules. Members proposing to register a new vehicle should obtain a copy to ensure they are familiar with requirements and responsibilities.

JANUARY GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Meeting opened at 19:32 hours on 19th January 2018 at the Club Shed. Attendance as per the attendance book.

Chair: W Fotheringham, Minutes: P Bradshaw.

Apologies: Jenny and Colin Fotheringham, Luke Franks, Denise Brown, Tim Brodie, Stephen Gummerson.

The main points of the last Committee Meeting were read. Minutes moved for acceptance by Charlie Vella, seconded by Ray Galdes, accepted by all members present.

MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

- Ian Browning – By Law 6 changes. Explanation and discussion was held into the recommended changes to the By Law. On the motion to adopt these changes by Ian Browning, seconded by Bevis Apps agreed to by all members present.
- Ian Browning – Moonbi car, machinery show and tractor trek on the 10 to 11 March 2018. There will be a bus from Sydney to the event along with accommodation for \$68 per person available. Ian needs to know if any member is interested along with numbers tonight, please see Ian.
- Invitations to the Clarendon Classic need to be sent out to other clubs. Peter Woodmore will handle the engine clubs, but someone is needed to organise the car clubs. There is a previous list of invitations to car clubs that have been contacted for reference. The invitation letter has been updated and is available.
- Ride trailers need work on the attendant to driver warning system and also have the roofs fitted. This work has been authorized by SAMCI members and will start in five to six weeks.
- RAS Easter Show – static displays need to be organized ASAP for this event. Engines and tractors are required for the display and all displays will be placed behind a fence away from public access. If any member is interested contact Ian Browning. The dates of the event are 23rd March to 3rd April 2018.
- At the last committee meeting it was suggested that at general meetings a talk at the end of the meetings should be given by a guest speaker or a club member doing a restoration. This action is hoped to make the meetings more interesting and a social event for attending members. With this in mind the committee meeting report will still be presented to the general meeting and any major items needing attention either a purchase or club decision will still be put to the club members for discussion and a decision. Joe Zahra raised the point that members need to know what the talk will be about well before the general meeting night. This will have a calendar produced so that members know what is happening. On the motion to introduce and conduct these information talks by Ian Browning, seconded by Morrie Barrett, accepted by majority of members present.
- Ian Browning – in regard to the previous item, Ian recommended that SAMCI purchase new audio visual equipment such as a projector and screen. On the motion to purchase this equipment by Ian Browning, seconded by Morrie Barrett accepted by members present.

- The Howard register tractor event at Colac, Victoria on the 3rd and 4th February 2018 has been sanctioned with travel to and from the event.

Treasurer's report – Morrie Barrett. As presented at the committee meeting.

On the motion to accept the Treasurer's by Ray Galdes, seconded by Charlie Vella, accepted by members present.

A request was made for a member to send out the invitations to car clubs. One of the themes for the next rally is Chevrolet and all clubs with this interest will be invited. Ray Galdes offered to take on this job. Ray's offer was accepted with thanks. Australia Day at the Pioneer Village has about 15 members attending. W Fotheringham is organising a tractor trek on the day to the village 7:30 for an 8:00am start from Col's place.

GROUNDS: Weeds sprayed and mower to have a service.

NEWSLETTER: Need more items for the newsletter.

JUNIORS: The Juniors will be holding a meeting before the next general meeting.

NEW MEMBERSHIP: Two new membership applications received, Mario Cauchi and Laurence Galea, which were put to the members for acceptance. Both new members were accepted by all members present.

GENERAL BUSINESS

- Tony Pettitt stated that Cosco is prepared to get tyres for tractors and equipment through Bridgestone industrial supplies. This also includes batteries at a reduced price, contact Tony with any enquires.
- AED – Luke Franks has had a meeting with the Hawkesbury Heart Start group and has been given a cost of \$2500 to \$3000 for a machine. They are unable to offer a subsidy. Gayle Miller asked for the model description as she had received quotes for two other machines about the same costing. Gayle stated that all the machines should be reviewed to select the best one with cost, ease of use and servicing costs. Gayle and Luke to discuss, and Gayle to purchase the unit selected (previously approved by the club).
- Luke Franks – stated that a company Aqualuma LED Lighting has agreed to donate three external flood lights to SAMCI. Luke to arrange installation when available.
- Jim Bew displayed a range of different club badges he has collected. It has been suggested that SAMCI purchase a number of larger style badges to sell to members. Ian Browning will approach a badge manufacturer to assist with artwork and obtain costings.

DUNEDOO TRACTOR TREK 2019

The 2019 Dunedoo Tractor Trek is set to take place on the October long weekend (4th – 7th October, 2019). The Trek will cater for all makes and models, various speeds (Bulldogs, Chamberlains, Fergys, David Browns, Fordsons, etc.), with three different treks each day (Saturday and Sunday). LAGGAN AUCTION REPORT

January 20th and 21st 2018, saw a 2 day auction at Laggan of the collection built up over very many years by Graham Clegg. Graham died aged 68 after a short illness in 2016. During his long collecting history which included a 19 year association with the Powerhouse museum he developed a reputation for expertise in many areas especially steam. Of the over 1000 items on offer many were keenly fought over by the steam enthusiasts many of whom had travelled for hours to get there. Spirited online bidding enabled bids to be received from overseas as well. To their credit auctioneers, Burns and Co drew bidders' attention to the restrictions on moving Australia's rare moveable heritage overseas. Pictures of all lots and their final (hammer) prices are still available on their website. Buyers' premiums of 15% local and 17.5% online applied.

While Graham's superb library and collection clearly had stood the test of time, many of his items dating to the middle of the 19th century, some much more modern technology was brought undone by the stifling heat (see iPhone screenshot). Around 300 keen bidders made it a great place to meet fellow enthusiasts and some valuable partnerships were formed. It became clear early that some enthusiasts would not be easily discouraged as prices rose and rose. For example, a pallet containing several steam chocks was knocked down for \$450 and a photo of a steam engine in operation Lot 972 went to \$1500. Despite the pressure for steam related material there were some occasional bargains, off theme. A pallet of large electric motors (#316) went for \$5 and a lisher with sanding disk on a pedestal (#610) went for \$120.

Mancave trophies such as bowsers, brass gauges, whistles, plaques and enamel signs reached record highs. A pedal car #1037 went for \$800 and an anvil #696 \$3200.

Without doubt the eyes of the auction were 2 semi restored (dismantled) portable steam engines (#581 Clyde \$20,000 and Southern Cross #1128 \$36500) and an unrestored Fowlers steam traction engine (#1129 \$52500). A Reeco-Rider - Ericsson hot air engine# 961 went for \$20,000.

My own purchases were very modest. I'll treasure my "new" (1902-3) McInnes Dobbie steam Indicator. Mine is identical to item B2307 in the Powerhouse Museum collection. I also scored much related literature which will, hopefully, enable me to generate indicator cards that graph a steam engine's piston pressure against the position of the flywheel. Those cards diagnose and confirm the state of tune of a steam engine. I'm now also the proud owner of a complete set of TOMM going back to 1985.

AUSTRALIA DAY AT FAGAN PARK

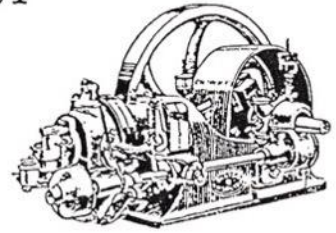
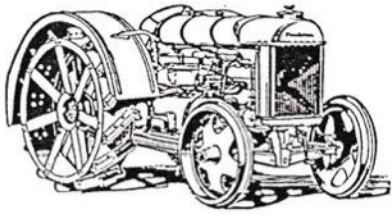
Although not a SAMCI event, we had a very good day at Fagan Park on Australia Day, with all our museums open, and a good public turnout taking up every bit of shade in the park.

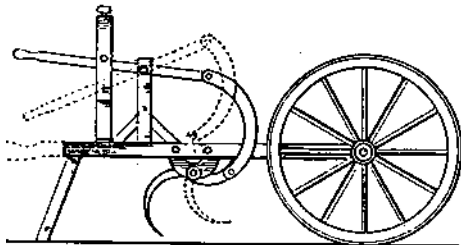
NEWS...



For this weeks 'Blast from the Past,' I have chosen two articles. One one a Potato-Digging Machine (originally taken from a book called 'Mechanical Appliances', all the way back in 1917, and an article on Australian Tractors. I thought that this was a perfect combination for all our engine and tractor lovers!

FROM THE PAST..... POTATO-DIGGING MACHINE.

By means of this invention the potatoes are not only dug from the ground, but may be separated from the dirt and deposited in piles to enable them to be conveniently gathered later on. The machine comprises a double wheel truck or barrow, carrying a series of curved teeth which are formed in one piece, after the manner of a rake. These teeth are operated by means of a pivoted lever which forces them into the ground just at the rear of a of potatoes. A reverse movement of the lever lifts the dirt and potatoes above the surface, and the dirt is sifted out between the teeth until only the potatoes remain. A slight movement of the barrow to one side tilts the potatoes out on the ground between the hills, when the machine is advanced to the next hill and the operation is repeated.

TWO UNIQUE AUSTRALIAN TRACTORS

Using their experience as Australia's pioneer tractor manufacturers, Howards now produce two unique tractor units.

OVER 25 years ago Howards became Australia's first quantity producer of agricultural tractors, and the introduction of the famous DH-22 tractor and rotary hoe in 1934 marked a new era in agricultural machinery manufacture in this country.

The DH-22, wholly designed and manufactured in Australia, was an extremely robust 27 bhp unit with a wide range of rotary hoeing and travel gears, and soon proved its ability to tackle the toughest cultivation conditions. This tractor sold in large numbers, and many of the original DH-22's are still in use, particularly with rotary hoe contractors.

Rugged and tough, the DH-22 established firmly the tradition that

has guided Howard development and manufacture — that agricultural machinery for Australia must be designed specifically for Australian conditions, with maximum strength and durability and minimum maintenance requirements.

Rotary Hoe Tractor still Produced

The DH-22 was succeeded by the DH-226, a more modern rotary hoe tractor with a Le Roi type engine manufactured under licence by Howards, and developing 33 bhp. The DH-226 has proved of particular value to contractors and to sugarcane growers.

DH-226's were exported in quantity to Indonesia in 1956, where they were used for the control ofalang grass, a heavy growth similar to New

Guinea Kunai; here, in heavy clay soil, withalang standing taller than the muffer and as thick as a pick handle, a thorough job of cultivation was done—another job that only an Australian rotary hoe could handle.

The Mighty Little One

Also in production at Northmead is the "Kelpie" 5.2 hp tractor. With a genuine 500 lb drawbar pull, the Kelpie is no toy. It has a wide range of attachments, including an 8 inch mouldboard plough, disc harrows, toolbar and scarifier tyres, spray, dozer blade and tipcart. It is widely used by dairyfarmers, market gardeners and small area growers, poultry farmers, country airports—with cart attached, the Kelpie largely replaces the "one-horse dray" of a generation ago.
