## CLUB NEWS – FROM THE SECRETARY

### MEMBERSHIP RENEWALS

Membership renewals are trickling in. With June upon us, get your form completed and payment in before the due date. Vehicle owners are reminded their vehicle registration is voided if Club membership lapses.

### JULY CLUB SOCIAL

Your Club is having its mid-year social on Saturday, July 27<sup>th</sup>, from 3.00pm. It's a great chance to enjoy the company of fellow members. Those wishing to attend should register with Margaret Barrett and pay the \$5.00 per person cost beforehand so that catering can be planned.

### CLUB REGISTERED VEHICLES

With many registration renewals due in June, you are reminded a 60-day logbook is to be requested for ALL vehicles, and make sure RMS issues a new Conditions of Approved Operations document at the same time. When renewing vehicles on CVS, the fee to be paid to APMC for processing has been increased to \$30 from now on. This is to cover Express Post for return of paperwork, as there have been many complaints about the turn-around time as well as reports of some going astray in the mail system. With express Post, there is tracking of the item.

Clubs have been advised that comprehensive insurance for HVS and CVS vehicles through NRMA will not accept a claim if used for driving to and from work or to shops, even though this does not appear in their PDS. Shannons state that the vehicle is covered if being used within RMS guidelines, meaning that the 60-day logbook must be completed correctly. So please be aware of this restriction on cover by NRMA.

### TAG-ALONG TOUR

The NSW Southern Motoring Association with which we are affiliated has organised a "Tag-Along Tour" taking place between 25 October and 3 November, starting in Bathurst, and ending at Pambula/Merimbula. The itinerary covers Bathurst, Orange, Forbes, Parkes, West Wyalong, Temora, Wagga, Albury, Jinderra, Tumut, Cooma, and finally Pambula. Participants can join or leave the tour as they wish. Accommodation is pre-reserved (you have to make your own bookings) and visits to motoring clubs, points of interest, technical talks and Q&A sessions will be conducted along the way. ## MAY GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Meeting opened at 7:30pm on the 17<sup>th</sup> of May 2019, at the Club Shed.

Attendance as per the attendance book.

Chair: Peter Bradshaw, Minutes: Peter Bradshaw.

Apologies: Tim Brodie, Luke Franks, Steve Muscat and Russell Gear.

Minutes of the last meeting were read, summarised and approved.

### MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

- Ian Browning has a contact, selling Villiers engines, see Ian for details.
- The rally registration form has been upgraded with the purchase of large rally badges included.
- The Hawkesbury show event has been conducted and all who attended thought it went very well.
- The Riverstone Parade was conducted with around 10 SAMCI members attending with vehicles.
- The Junior group displayed their new banner and signs at the Hawkesbury Show.
- The Deutz engine pressure vessel has been tested and the certifier is reluctant to pass the vessel. However, no report has been received as yet. It is thought that a new or replacement vessel will need to be purchased. Matt Vella offered a cylinder that he has which might be suitable. This to be further investigated.
- The mounting of the club BBQs onto a trailer was discussed with a majority of members present rejecting the idea.
- The SAMCI yearly outing was discussed with an interest to attend the Lithgow Small Arms factory. This was suggested to occur during August on a Sunday. Peter Bradshaw to investigate details.
- The intended attendance of SAMCI members at Friends of Linnwood event has been cancelled due to the members not being able to attend. Friends of Linnwood to be notified.

### SUB COMMITTEES

**MAJOR EVENTS:** It was reported that the Hawkesbury Show was a very good event with all members attending helping to setup and packing up of the club equipment. This help needs to be carried through to the rally with all members helping to prepare the rally grounds and fill rosters. Rally rosters are now available for members to volunteer their services. **GROUND:** The poisoning of the Khaki weed will be done again shortly when a suitable poison is obtained.

**JUNIOR GROUP:** The Juniors had a very big display at the Hawkesbury Show with their new banner proudly displayed. Also, the Juniors have a Facebook page and asked members to have a look and post a like for them. They also need to develop an article to be submitted to the TOMM magazine.

**NEW MEMBERS:** Two new members were considered for membership: Raymond George and Ian Shaw. Both membership applications were put to members present for acceptance and were approved.

### GENERAL BUSINESS

- The following five events have been sanctioned by SAMCI:
  - The Mudgee Small Farms Field Days at Mudgee on the 13-14 July 2019.
  - Cranky Handle rally at Richmond Vale on the 17-18 August 2019.
  - The Dunedoo tractor trek around Dunedoo on the 5-7 October 2019.
  - Hilltops Heritage Rally at Carrington Park, Young on the 7-8 December 2019.
  - "Tag Along Tour" organized by Southern Motoring Association starting at Bathurst on 25 October, finishing at Pambula on 3 November. See newsletter for more information.
- Ray Galdes asked are sanctioned events mainly for insurance for engine displays. Answer yes as vehicles can use the 60 day log book system and are covered by TPI and private insurance.

- Charlie Bartolo asked for the Museum of Fire Sydney Classic & Antique Truck show to be sanctioned. This event has already been sanctioned.
- Ian Browning stated that the SMA has advised its member clubs that NRMA does not cover driving to and from shops or to work. Shannons state that vehicles are covered if being used in accordance with RMS rules e.g. 60-day logbook.
- Steve Muscat has advised that the current security company used at the rally cannot provide any services for the next rally. SAMCI will need to find another security contractor.
- Bill Robertson has some pictures in frames of static trucks parked on properties for sale \$50 each.
- Ian Browning stated that the rally registration form has been upgraded for the sale of the rally badges.
- Denise Brown asked if SAMCI could buy a pressure washer to clean the kitchen mats. It was suggested that a club member could supply a pressure washer when required. Peter Bradshaw to clean the mats on the next grounds day.
- Jim Bew supplied a quote to line mark the club drive way with no parking for \$573.87. To be submitted to HDAA for their approval.
- Ron Irving will be taking a trip to the USA over the next two months and will bring back plenty of articles for the newsletter.
- Charlie Bartolo complained about the parking at the Hawkesbury Show in the SAMCI compound with too many members' cars inside the grounds. He stated that some members could not get in to display and left. This member was told at the time there is no room in the grounds as the grand parade was to start and could he wait till room was available but he decided to go home.
- Ray Galdes mentioned that the stove flue still has a galvanized pipe fitted, which could give of harmful fumes. It was put to the members present and the decision was made to replace the flute with a more suitable pipe.

## STEVE FEMBOCK'S RESTORATIONS

As a new member this year to the club my interests are in stationary engines. This is just a small outline to the restoration of my champion 2hp hit miss. Offered on gumtree for \$300 from a deceased estate in Sydney it had been sitting in the shed for 60 years plus. It had come off a cement mixer apparently used by the DMR hence the yellow paint over it all including the timber. Apart from the tank all original but just worn and needing a lot of time and degreaser. Knowing very little about them at this stage I had a lot to learn. Luckily, I had a new found friend from the central coast club who has 20 years experience and 2 engines identical. So after temporarily fixing the spring tensioning the lever on the side and the fuel line and check valve and after much cleaning, I was able to get it firing and running 60 years on. After much advice I decided to pull it down now and sandblast the lot followed by 2 pac paint work. The bore was good with lots of compression and the valves sat nicely needing just a very light grind. The timing was out with a worn and wrongly shaped cam lobe which was giving all sought of problems with the exhaust valve closing before the piston reached top end. A newly made check valve looks like it's stopped the problem of the engine double cycling to draw enough fuel to fire, although the double action would look impressive on show. So, 18 months after purchase it's on a nice steerable timber trolley running well and been given a new life hopefully for people to enjoy. Sure, there is still teething problems but that seems to be all part of it and I hope to be rallying it soon for the club.
